TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS

Explanation:

Hit and Run Crashes – A crash resulting in colliding with a person, their personal property (including their motor vehicle), or a fixture, and failing to stop and identify oneself afterwards.

Accident Within Construction Zone – A crash occurring in a posted construction zone.

Accident Involving Police on Duty - A crash where one of the vehicles involved in the accident was a police officer on duty.

Accident Involving Government Property - A crash involving damage to government property.

Reported Accidents – Total number of accidents that resulted in injury or death of any person, any damage to government owned non-vehicle property to an apparent extent of \$200 or more, or total damage to property owned by any one person to an apparent extent of \$1,000 or more.

Accident Involving Fatal Injury - An injury received in a traffic crash that results in death within thirty (30) days of the crash.

Accidents that Involved Injuries – A motor vehicle traffic crash involving one or more persons who were physically harmed or who complained of physical harm but were not killed.

Accidents that did not Involve Injuries – A motor vehicle traffic crash that resulted in no apparent injury to one or more persons involved.

Type of Units Involved in Accidents – A way of identifying a load vehicle or a pedestrian involved in a crash. There are seven general categories of unit type:

Auto - Passenger car, police car, ambulance, etc.

Truck - Utility truck, straight truck, fire truck, truck tractor

(not attached, semi attached, double bottom), motor home. **Motorcycle** - Motorcycle, moped, motor scooter, etc.

Bus - School bus, passenger bus, etc.

Equipment - Farm tractor and other self-propelled farm equipment, other working machines (e.g. forklift, grader, end loader, etc.), railroad train, snow plow, snowmobile, all-terrain vehicle, and miscellaneous.

Bicycle - Every non-motorized device propelled by the feet acting upon the pedals including unicycles, bicycles, tricycles, etc.

Pedestrian - Any person afoot (or using assistive devices). This includes someone getting on or off a vehicle.

Number of People Injured In Accidents – An injury, other than fatal, that prevents walking, driving, or performing other activities that were performed before the crash or an injury that is not evident at the scene but that is claimed by the individual or suspected by the law enforcement officer or an injury other than fatal or incapacitating that is evident at the scene which includes known symptoms.

PROPERTY DATA

Explanation:

Foreclosed Property - Properties, as defined by the City of Milwaukee Department of City Development, identified as being foreclosed.

City Owned Tax Foreclosed Properties - Parcels conveyed since January 1, 2006 with a conveyance type of "sheriff deed," and no conveyance fee.

Bank Owned Foreclosed Properties - Parcels conveyed since January 1, 2007 with a conveyance type of "judgment - in rem action."

Tax Exempt Properties - Data set contains a listing of parcels classified as exempt by the City of Milwaukee Assessor's Office.

Non Owner Occupied - Data set is determined by comparing the property address to the owners mailing address, if these two do not match the property is consider non-owner occupied

Tax Delinquent - Data set contains a listing of parcels where the property tax has not been paid by that years deadline.

Property Service Requests - Data set represents building violations identified by the City of Milwaukee.

Permits - Data set includes all current construction, plumbing and electrical permits for the City of Milwaukee.

Property Service Requests - Data set represents the building inspection requests for the City of Milwaukee.

Parcels - Outline of property.

Residential Assessed Value - Data set represents the assessed value of each

residential parcel in the City of Milwaukee.

Neighborhood Strategic Planning Area - 18 Neighborhood Strategic Planning Areas (NSP) in the City of Milwaukee.

Neighborhood - Factors used to define neighborhood areas are as followed: Subdivisions, major streets, physical and natural barriers, community group boundaries, housing styles, historic areas and residents' opinions. Creating Neighborhoods gives residents an opportunity to develop a sense of place, pride and belonging in relation to where they live. Neighborhood boundaries are defined by the City of Milwaukee Department of City Development.

Police Districts - As of July 12th 2009 the City of Milwaukee Police District Boundaries have been changed. Any past reports by Police District cannot be compared with reports generated after July 12th 2009.

CRIME

Wisconsin Incident Based Report (WIBR) Group A offenses

Explanation:

Some crime incidents are represented by multiple records. This occurs when multiple victims, or related variables, are associated with an incident.

Homicide - The willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.

Assault - An attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or injury.

Sex Offenses - Any sexual act directed against another person, forcibly and/or against their will; or, not forcibly or against the person's will where the victim is incapable of giving consent. Include crimes (Forcible Rape, Forcible Sodomy, Sexual Assault With an Object, Forcible Fondling, Incest, Statutory Rape)

Robbery - The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or putting the victim in fear of immediate harm.

Burglary - The unlawful entry of a structure (both residential and non-residential) with intent to commit a theft.

Vehicle Theft - Theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle

Theft - The unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another.

Arson - Any willful burning or attempt to burn a building, motor vehicle, aircraft, or personal property of another.

Criminal Damage To Property - Willfully injuring, damaging, mutilating, defacing, destroying or substantially impairing the use of any property in which another has an interest without the consent of such other person.

Locked Vehicle Entry - Whoever intentionally enters the locked and enclosed portion or compartment of the vehicle of another without consent and with intent to steal.

An orthophoto combines the visual properties of a photograph with the geometric qualities of a map and offers a realistic visualization of the landscape.
